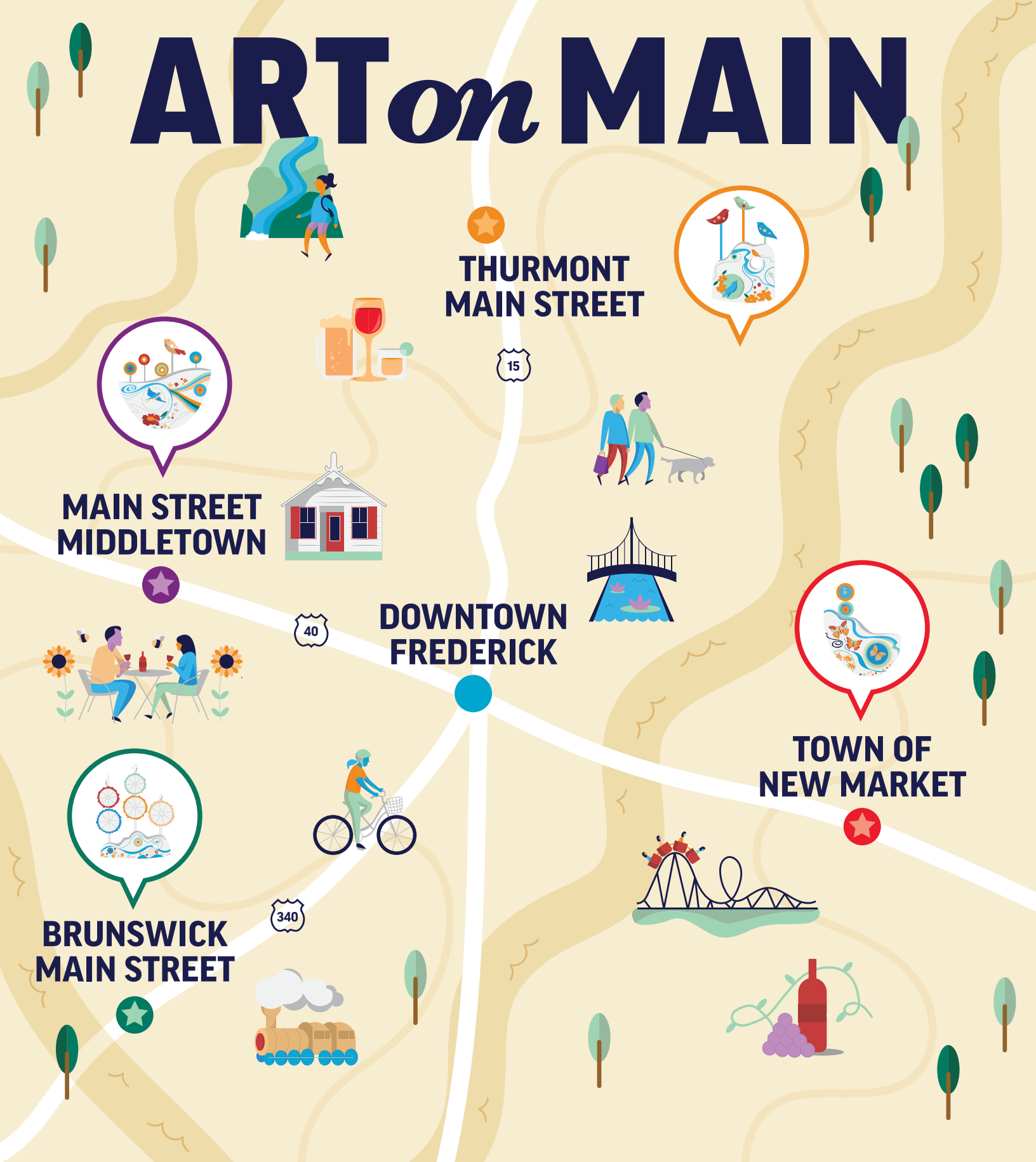

This sculpture reflects Brunswick's natural and man-made resources like the historic C&O Canal, rumbling railroads, and the flowing Potomac River. A scenic bike ride along the towpath is the best way to see everything Brunswick has to offer, lending its spoked wheels to the top of this piece. Brunswick's sculpture is located near the train station at 101 S. Maple Avenue.

"The Heart of the Beautiful Valley"

Nestled in the valley, Middletown is home to dairy farms and flowing fields. This sculpture's shape mirrors this movement, both in its design and colors, mimicking the soft green farmland surrounding the town and celebrating Middletown's agricultural roots, which are still evident today. Middletown's sculpture is located in the plaza near the entrance to The Main Cup which is located at 14 West Main Street.

"Gateway to the Mountains"

Thurmont is where the mountains meet the sky. The Catoclin Mountains invite you to explore all the beauty, wildlife, and natural resources found in several parks and along the Thurmont Trolley Trail. This sculpture imitates this panoramic landscape with its ribbons of color, evoking a sense of openness and splendor. Thurmont's sculpture is located at the town office at 615 East Main Street.
